Program: "Genealogy and Health History" Speaker: Charlien Tice, Registered Nurse, Retired after 44 years of Hospital Nursing

I grew up knowing basic genealogy about both sides of my family, just enough to wonder about more. I actually started doing genealogy research in 1980s when my mother couldn't answer some of my questions about the Tices. Eventually I realized we had missed our opportunities to question the family members who had already passed away. I then dragged both my mom and sister Liz into a search of the Greeks since there were some still alive, (my mother and her sisters). The rest is history as they say.

We often check death certificates and other death records on our ancestors for dates and other information.. Consider looking for cause of death as well.

I Be aware many of the medical terms used in old documents for various conditions are not what we are using today.

II Some diseases and conditions do reoccur in

families. Awareness of those diseases can be minimized or prevent health problems. III Common disease that reoccur in families:

1 High blood pressure, high cholesterol, food allergies

- 3 Certain types of cancer

V Manage your own health

- 1 Regular check-ups

Alphabetical listing of births appearing in the Harney County newspapers. Original birth announcements may be viewed on microfilm in the Western History Room. Currently available online through 1954. Full index from 1887 through 2000 is available in hard copy in the Claire McGill Luce Western History Room. More listings will be added to this site as they are computerized.

Marriage Index

Alphabetical listings of marriages that appeared in local Harney County newpapers. Currently available online from 1887-1925. Additional listings will be posted on this site as soon as they are computerized. Hard copy listings of marriage announcements from 1887-2000 are available in the Western History Room. Original news items may be viewed or copied from microfilm.

Photo Index

Alphabetical listing of people and places and subjects identified in photographs currently indexed in the archives of the Western History Room. Additional photographs within the collection are not currently indexed or are unidentifed. If you are looking for a subject that is not listed on this site, please contact the staff of the Western History Room or visit the archives in person to view the entire collection.

Individual & Family Histories

A collection of individual and family histories including diaries, journals, personal life stories, news articles, and genealogical information about residents of Harney County, past and present

Oral History Index

Alphabetical listing of people interviewed for Harney County Oral Histories, with year interviewed and transcript number. Transcripts are available in the file cabinets in front of the Western History Room door. Original recordings are available inside the Western History Room. Digital copies of transcripts are also available. Contact staff of the Western History Room for more information.

Death and Obituary Index

Alphabetical listing of deaths and obituaries of individuals as they appeared in the various Harney County newspapers from 1887present. This is not a completely comprehensive list. There are many death listings which have not yet been included on this index. Most obituaries can be looked up in person on microfilm at the Claire McGill Luce Western History Room. Click on the names in bold text to view obituaries which currently have digital files available. Underlined names have obituaries on file, not vet uploaded to this site. Some names have more than one news item or an obituary in multiple pages associated with them. Visit the Western History Room or contact staff for copies of obituaries not yet uploaded to this site or to inquire about a name

Quaker Genealogy Books in WVGS Collection

Quakers kept records from their earliest days. Monthly meeting records are where you'll find most of the details about your Quaker ancestors. The records of the Society of Friends, also known as Quakers, include births, deaths, marriages, migration certificates, and detailed monthly meeting minutes. Many of these records have been indexed or microfilmed.

<u>Google tips to help you navigate</u> <u>genealogy database websites</u>

Start broad and narrow your search.

 Start with a general, broad search. Based on what you receive in search results, then use the search logic associated with the particular website search engine to narrow your search.

Starting with a name.

 The search engine will first look for an exact name match, followed by common variants, misspellings, and nicknames. For example, a search for Bill Smith might return "William Smith," "Wm Smith," "Bill Smith," and "B. Smith."

Filling in the blanks.

• When you are entering the data for your search, you must have at least the last name. The other fields can be blank. You don't have to fill in all the fields of your query.

Be careful with abbreviations.

Search engines find only exact matches. If you have used abbreviations, retype your search string using alternatives—for example, PA, then Penn, then Pennsylvania. Avoid abbreviations for descriptive terms (such as Sgt., Co., Reg't., Dr., or Jr.). Do not enter titles (like Dr., Earl, or Queen) or suffixes (3rd, III, or Jr.). Just search for the name without the title and then check the results for the ones you want.

Use of quotation marks " ".

- Quotation marks are used in searches to denote that you are specifically looking for these words in this order. For example, you are looking for John Lee in Florida, then in your query you would enter John Lee Florida. Chances are, you would receive all the Johns in Lee County, Florida. By using quotations, you are able to make the search more targeted and avoid a lot of unwanted search results. The query now becomes "John Lee" Florida. The search will include results that include both John Lee and Florida.
- By using quotation marks, you tell the search engine that you want the words surrounded in quotations to be in exactly the order you have them.
