Program: First Murder in Polk County
"Murder and Politics" is presented by Tom Branigar. This talk is about the first murder in Polk
County. Cyrenius C. Hooker, an early settler, was murdered by Return William Everman, a transient laborer, in February 1852. Everman was hanged for the crime so it was also the first hanging in Polk

County.

This was the first murder in Polk County, and also the first murder trial, the first jail break and the first hanging. It makes an interesting case study because it shows how the county government could improvise when faced with a new situation. A few officials of the territorial government also became involved, so it can show how some politicians can take advantage of a tragedy to further their own political agendas.

Tom was born in Salem, Oregon, and grew up in Monmouth. In graduate school he studied archives and records management at Western Washington University. From 1977 to 2008 Tom was an archivist

at the Dwight D. Eisenhower Library in Abilene, Kansas, a branch of the National Archives. Significant collections on which he worked include the White House Central Files, the records of the National Security Council staff, and the personal papers of a number of administration officials. He also served as the Library's expert on the Eisenhower genealogy, and helped answer inquiries about President Eisenhower's family background. Tom retired in October 2008 and returned to the Salem area. He is now volunteering part time as an archivist at the Polk County Museum in Rickreall.

Financial Issues

- We rent space at Candalaria Terrace to store our books and periodicals. We also use the office as a meeting place for our committees. Rent increased on February 1st from \$315 a month to \$324. 45. In addition we have to have insurance at Candalaria for liability and loss, which also covers our books at Salem Public Library. This costs us \$465 a year.
- 2. Our constitution requires an audit of our Treasurer's books each year. Barbara Hunter and Kerry Wymetalek volunteered to do that. They'll report at the March meeting.
- 3. We also needed to have proposed budget for 2016, which our Treasurer Lauren Teubner with Barbara and Kerry's help also completed and we'll approve that at the March meeting.
- 4. Overall we are in a good financial position. However we can only afford our office space for about 5 years. We need additional funds or plans to move our collections.
