President's Report for March 13, 2021

The General Meeting scheduled for March 13th was cancelled due to the continuing COVID-19 pandemic. Members were notified in the March newsletter that the meeting had been cancelled. The Executive Board **did** meet on March 11, 2021.

1. Treasurer's report: Barbara Foster compiled a Treasurer's report for the month of February. For February: Income for Operations was Fred Meyer Reward \$33.89, \$65.00 donations, \$62.60 for research, \$132 for voided checks, \$1,000 transferred from savings, \$2.49 interest for a total income for the month of \$1,295.98. Expenses for operations were rent at Candalaria \$344.21, \$55 newsletter stamps, \$55 research stamps, \$82 replace lost check, total -\$536.21. BALANCE of checking and savings on February 28, 2021 was \$32,510.50.

Membership Report from Sue Rempel: We have 2 Societies, 20 Life members, 10 families/20 members, and 52 singles for 84 memberships or 94 members. Craig Smith has been recruiting new members!
 General Meeting and speaker were cancelled. We scheduled a Zoom meeting, hosted by Doug on March 13th, which was an open discussion. He has been working with Dave Bruey on a Genealogy Treasure Hunt. The Board approved the cost of prizes for the Treasure Hunt. Contest will be held online April 16 to June 1st.

4. Salem Public Library is closed. Volunteers will not be at the desk. The Library will not be returning to the Broadway location and is scheduled to start moving back to the Library building this summer.

5. Corresponding Secretary Tony Hoff reported "We received 6 research requests in February, all came to our society and with a wide variety of subjects. There were requests for 20 obituaries, 4 marriage records, 3 death records, followed by requests for an immigration date, census report, Findagrave Memorial, list of surnames at a cemetery and information on ancestors who lived in Salem, MA.

6. Craig Smith- the first issue of Beaver Briefs for 2021 has been sent out.

7. Dennis Hill—kept the website updated. Will work on an interactive membership form for the website.

8. Old Business – americanancestors.org subscription not renewed at this time. Deanne Smith is working on an index for Beaver Briefs issues 40-49.

 The newest generation of researchers start their search not in a library, but on a computer keyboard. The problem is that they often don't know what 	
they are missing when it comes to what genealogy societies have to offer. So, we do have to let them know.	
What is the problem with these suggestions? They all require ACTIVE people

These extensive databases can help you connect to lineages that are sometimes lost due to data destruction (fires etc.), or migrations across political boundaries.

National Archives: we're charting a course through the cartographic holdings at the National Archives.

How do I search the Catalog for maps and charts?

- ⇒ It is best to search the Catalog for a topic, name or phrase and then narrow down the search results using filters. You may need to do several different searches to find the records you are interested in.
- \Rightarrow You can review our Catalog Search Tips.
- ⇒ If you are looking for a name or phrase, put those terms in quotations for the search, example "New York".
- \Rightarrow Search results bring back all formats of records. Use the filters on the left side to narrow your results to Maps and Charts.
- ⇒ Not all of the descriptions in the Catalog include digitized records. To see those that have digital images in the Catalog, after conducting a search, use the filter on the left side to narrow your results to Archival Descriptions with Digital Objects.
- ⇒ If you find a record you'd like to use, you can download it. For a video tutorial, please see How to Download Records from the National Archives Catalog.
- \Rightarrow If you have a question about a description in the Catalog, reach out to the reference staff listed in the Contact(s) section.

NEW HAMPSHIRE State, territorial, and colonial censuses

New Hampshire took early listing of individuals that will help locate family members. The responses and years of coverage may give additional information on the family. *Family History Library:*

Census of New Hampshire, for the years 1767-1775, Film

1776 State census of men over age 21 who declared their Revolutionary War position. Jay Mack Holbrook compiled the New Hampshire 1776 Census, Holbrook Research Institute, Book, which lists name, town and county of residence, whether for or against the Revolutionary War, and page number. The page number refers to the New Hampshire Provincial and State Papers, volume 30, which is available online through <u>www.ancestry.com</u>.

Genealogy Research during COVID-19 Pandemic

Are you getting tired of online genealogy research?? Try something different:

- Start a family history book or scrapbook.
- * Take a DNA test.
- * Learn the language of your ancestors.
- * Cook a dish from an ancestral land.
- * Record your own life story.
- * Scan and organize old family photos.
- * Record family traditions.
- * Learn about an ancestor's occupation.
- Upload pictures to your online family tree.
- * Join a genealogy Facebook group.
- * Add citations to your family tree.
- * Organize your genealogy files.
- * Organize and tag digital photos.
- * Watch a genealogy webinar.
- * Map your ancestors.

- Pick an ancestor and research as many details as you can. Go beyond vital records and dig as deep as you can to learn more. Newspapers are one good option, as they can be a great source of information about everyday life.
- * Be a Virtual Volunteer! Index or transcribe records online, or contribute to other online projects. FamilySearch's indexing program is probably the most well known, but other libraries, archives, and organizations also have projects that use volunteers.
