President's Report for April 10, 2021

The General Meeting scheduled for April 10th was cancelled due to the continuing COVID-19 pandemic. Members were notified in the April newsletter that the meeting had been cancelled. The Executive Board did meet on April 8, 2021.

1. Treasurer's report: Barbara Foster compiled a Treasurer's report for the month of March.

For March 2021: Income for Operations was from donations \$40, research \$97.60, Postage to mail Beaver Briefs \$7 and \$2.86 interest for a total income for the month of \$147.46. Expenses for operations were rent at Candalaria \$344.21, newsletter copy card \$50, postage to mail Vol 53 #1 of Beaver Briefs \$46.80, Oregon tax filing fee \$20, total \$461.01. BALANCE of checking and savings on February 28, 2021 was \$32,196.95. Thank you to Claudine Shaw and Thomas Branigar for donations!

- 2. Membership Report from Sue Rempel: We have 2 Societies, 20 Life members, 12 families/24 members, and 76 singles for 110 memberships or 122 members. - 3. Meetings and speaker were cancelled. We scheduled a Zoom meeting, hosted by Doug on April 10, which was be an open discussion and plan another on May 8th. The Genealogy Treasure Hunt will be from April 16, 2021 to June 1, 2021. Rules and Questions will be posted on the website as well as sent by email to members.
- 4. Salem Public Library is closed. Volunteers will not be at the desk. The Library is scheduled to start moving back to the Library building in May. Opening depends on the pandemic.
- 5. Deanne Smith has been working on an index to issues 40-49 for Beaver Briefs. We will only print 2 copies.
- 6. Corresponding Secretary Tony Hoff reported "We had 7 research requests in March, and they were all sent to our society. There were requests for 10 obituaries, a passenger list, a descendancy chart and to update a family tree.

From American Ancestors Winter 2021 (Summary):

In 1929 Good Housekeeping Magazine ran an article entitled "Abraham Lincoln Was **a Lee".** The claim has been accepted and repeated by others as if it were a proven fact! Now comes DNA:

Lincoln's Lee family line is haplogroup R1b, while General Lee's family line is 11a. Not only did the haplotypes between the two Lee families not match, neither did the broader haplogroups. Since the two Lee families belong to different haplogroups, at a minimum any common ancestor would have lived thousands of years ago. Both docu-

mentary and DNA evidence has proved that President Abraham Lincoln's ancestor William Lee, husband of Dorothy, was not a grandson of General Robert E. Lee's ancestor Col. Richard Lee. In this case, as in many others, when documentary evidence is lacking, DNA evidence can often fill in the gaps and bring the truth to light. Richard Hall

1950 United States Census—Release Date

The date 1 April 2022 can't come fast enough! Why? Because that is the date of the release of the 1950 United States census. As you wait for the release of the census, learn more about what you can expect from the 1950 census and what records you can search in the meantime!

When and How Will the 1950 Census Be Released?

The National Archives releases a census to the public only 72 years after the day the census was taken. Because census day in 1950 was 1 April, the 1950 census will be released to the public on the same date in 2022.

In 2012, the National Archives provided digital images of the 1940 census to FamilySearch. Then FamilySearch uploaded those digital images to their website. Those who had a free FamilySearch account were able to see the digital images right away. However, the records were not indexed and so had to be searched page-by-page by location. We expect the same thing to happen for the 1950 census.

Details of the Release of the 1950 United States Census

The 1950 census population questionnaire asked fewer questions than its predecessor; the full population was asked only 20 questions:

Population

- 1. Name of street, avenue or road where the household is located
- 2. Home or apartment number
- 3. Serial number of dwelling unit
- 4. Is this house on a farm (or ranch)?
- 5. If no, is this house on a place of three or more acres?
- 6. Corresponding agriculture questionnaire number
- 7.Name
- 8. Relationship to head
- 9.Race
- 10. Sex
- 11. How old was this person on his last birthday?
- 12.Is this person now married, widowed, divorced, separated, or never married?

Enumerators were to enter "Mar" for married, "Wd" for widowed, "D" for divorced, "Sep" for separated, or "Nev" for never married

- 13. What State or country was the person born in?
- 14. If foreign born, is the person naturalized?

For persons 14 years of age and over

15. What was this person doing most of last week - working, keeping house, or something else?

Enumerators were to record "Wk" for working, "H" for keeping house, "U" for unable to work, or "Ot" for other

- 16. If the person was "keeping house" or "something else" in question 15, did the person do any work at all last week, not counting work around the house? (Including work-for-pay, in his own business, working on a farm or unpaid family work)
- 17. If the person answered "no" to question 16, was he looking for work?
- 18. If the person answered "no" to question 17, even if he didn't work last week, does he have a job or business?
- 19. If the person was working, how many hours did he or she work in the last week?
- 20. a. What kind of work does the person do?b.. What kind of business or industry is the person in?c Class of worker the person is. Enumerators were to mark "P" for private employment, "G" for government employment, "O" for own business, or "NP" for working without pay.

NEW JERSEY State, territorial, and colonial censuses

New Jersey often took censuses in the years between the federal censuses, the dates are listed below. State census records may have columns that were different or more unusual than those found on federal censuses. The responses and years of coverage may give additional information on the family.

The original records and microfilm copies of state censuses are at the New Jersey State Archives. Copies of the 1905 and 1915 censuses are also at the New Jersey Department of Health. The Newark Public Library, New Jersey State Library, Rutgers University Library, and Family History Library have microfilm copies of all New Jersey state censuses. State censuses were taken beginning in 1855. Some records are missing, as indicated below:

1885, 1895, 1905, 1915 - All counties are available.

1875 - Only Sussex and Essex counties are available.

1865 - Missing Cape May, Mercer, Morris, Ocean, Somerset, and Warren counties and incomplete for the others.

1855 - Missing Burlington, Cape May, Mercer, Middlesex, Ocean, and Salem counties and incomplete for the others.

1693 - A special census was taken of Swedes who were associated with the Swedish Lutheran Church and who were living in Pennsylvania, Delaware, west New Jersey, and Cecil County, Maryland. The census and an index to it are in Craig, Peter Stebbins. The 1693 Census of the Swedes on the Delaware. (Family History Library

1671 - New Castle County, Delaware; Philadelphia and Delaware counties in Pennsylvania; and Burlington County, New Jersey.


