President's Report July 10, 2021

The General Meeting scheduled for July 10th was cancelled due to the continuing COVID-19 pandemic. Members were notified in the July newsletter that the meeting had been cancelled. The Executive Board did meet on July 8, 2021.

1. Treasurer's report: Barbara Foster compiled a Treasurer's report for the month of June

For June 2021: Income for Operations was from donations \$2, research \$197, publication sales \$90 for a total income for the month of \$289. Expenses for operations were rent at Candalaria \$344.21, stamps for newsletter \$110, printing Beaver Briefs \$50, postage for mailing Beaver Briefs \$49.40, card stock for covers for Beaver Briefs \$14.55, total expenses -\$568.16. BALANCE of checking and savings on June 30, 2021, was \$32,046.06.

We discussed Pay Pal again and decided to go ahead with Pay Pal on our site for membership, publication sales, research and donations. Pay Pal will be linked to our checking account. We also have a new email for Pay Pal, which officers can access. Webmaster Dennis Hill, Corresponding Secretary (Research) Tony Hoff and Treasurer Barbara Foster will be able to access the Pay Pal account along with President Liz Tice who is setting it up.

2. Membership Report from Sue Rempel: We have 2 Societies, 20 Life members, 13 families/26 members, and 99 singles for 134 memberships or 147 members. New member is Douglas Henney of Lake Oswego, OR.

3. General Meeting and speaker were cancelled. We planned a Zoom meeting on July 10th from 10:30 am to 12 noon, if anyone contacts Doug to participate. We will have an in-person general meeting on August 14th at the VFW Hall. Program will be to have members talk about their genealogical research during the pandemic. We will also have a potluck, with the society providing drinks and deserts.

4. Salem Public Library has re-opened at Broadway. Volunteers will not be at the desk. The Salem Public Library is tentatively scheduled to open September 1, 2021 at the remodeled library on Liberty St. WVGS will have to shelve our books that we boxed up. Deanne Smith will be in charge of organizing volunteers to help. We hope to have volunteers working at the desk later in September.

5. Corresponding Secretary Tony Hoff reported "We received 3 research requests in June, all to our society. There was a request for birth & death dates of a paternal grandmother and for information on her third husband, a request for 4 generations of ancestors and the last request was to update a family tree on Ancestry."

6. There will be a meeting for volunteers before we open up again at SPL.

7. Beaver Briefs #3 is due out August 1st. We are sending publications list to all members and exchange societies and libraries.

8. Dennis Hill has kept the website updated, as well as the password list for new members.

9. New Business- we had 500 business cards printed (thanks to Craig Smith for design and suggestion). We agreed to do a genealogy workshop at Salem Public Library in February for "Salem Reads".

The National Archives USA "Behind Enemy Lines: WWII Escape and Evasion Reports"
The National Archives USA recently released "Behind Enemy Lines: WWII Escape and Evasion Reports" which are accounts of survival from U.S. soldiers in Europe during World War II. To Search for a name, click on Advanced Search at the top. Enter name in Search Terms field and 498 in Record Group Number / Collection ID:field. Then click Search.

SGT HAMELIN:

GRAFTON-UNDERWOOD I was engineer in the crew of which Lt PAULKINER was pilot (See 6 September 1943 E&E Rpt No. 172). We left GRAFTON-UNDERWOOD about 0630 on 6 September 1943 to bomb STUTTGART, made our rendezvous, and flew across northern France, following the course as briefed. I saw light flak all the way to the target but no fighter opposition. Our inter-phone worked badly almost from the time we hit the coast of France; it was out most of the time. At the target the weather was about nine-tenths, consequently we did not drop our bombs after making our bomb run as briefed, but circled three times and dropped our bombs on the way out. I could not see the results. I saw heavy flak. JU 88's and FW 190's attacked us. Our number four engine and numbers one and four fuel tanks were hit but I believe by flak. We also got many flak hits in the wings. As we went back, we were still in perfect formation, flying the return course as briefed. We met fighters all along the route.

Spotlight: Santa Clara Historical and Genealogical Society, California

The city of Santa Clara is located in Santa Clara County, CA, near the southern end of San Francisco Bay. The society has made several resources available under the Online Indexes tab on its website. Among these is the Early Settler File, an every name index to files on individuals living in Santa Clara County before 1925. The files comprise "fact sheets from patrons, news clippings, obituaries and funeral notices, books, photos, and other materials." They are currently being scanned. The online resources also include indexes to the 1852 special state census, early vital records, records from two funeral homes and two cemeteries, and Los Altos obituaries, plus links to local histories.

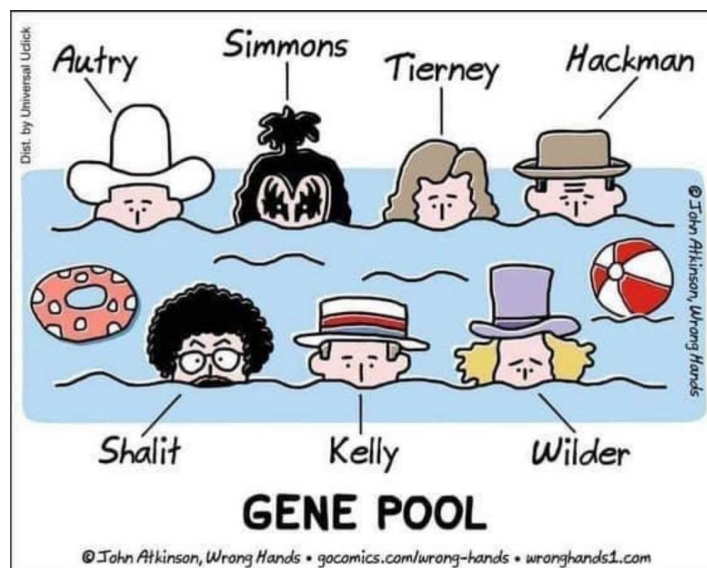

Independence, Missouri was the starting point for many wagons trains heading to Oregon. WVGS has a large collection of Missouri records, but for now they are in the basement of the Salem Public Library. Try this site: <https://shsmo.org/research>

The State Historical Society of Missouri has a substantial collection of digitized historic newspapers from throughout the state on its website. The collection is still growing, with 330,000 pages added recently. More than 400 titles cover most years from 1808 through 1994. Nearly all of the state's 114 counties are represented. The list of newspapers is sorted alphabetically, first by county and then by city/town. To begin your search, select and click a newspaper title link. This will open the search page. Next, enter your search terms to begin. Issues can also be browsed by date.

State Censuses



State Censuses

(This series was started in 2018 up until May 2020, but not finished in the newsletters. The complete list was published in Beaver Briefs.)

NORTH CAROLINA State, territorial, and colonial censuses

North Carolina took a few censuses in the years before the first federal census was taken. The dates are listed below. These censuses may have columns that were different or more unusual than those found on federal censuses. The responses and years of coverage may give additional information on the family.

Family History Library:

1784-1787 State census: Book. 24 of the 50 counties then existing. This census took three years to complete. It shows heads of households, their residence, and the age categories of their household members. It is indexed.

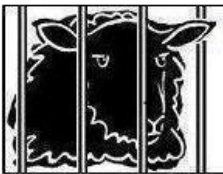

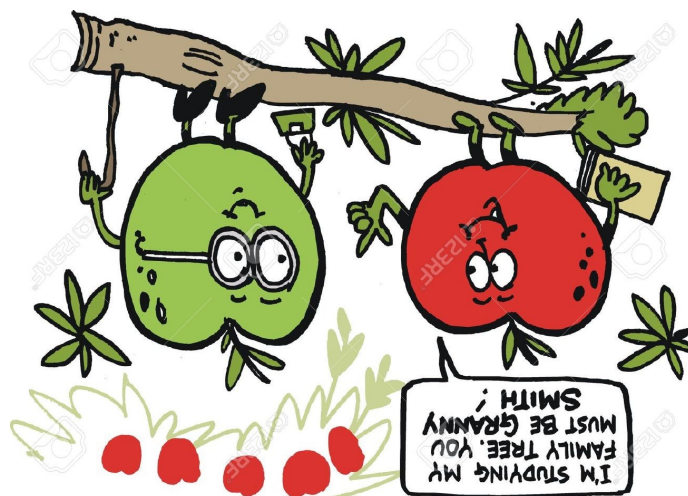
