WVGS News

President's Report September 11, 2021

The General Meeting scheduled for September 11th was cancelled due to the continuing COVID-19 pandemic. Members were notified in the September newsletter that the meeting had been cancelled. The Executive Board did meet on September 9, 2021.

1. Treasurer's report: Barbara Foster compiled a Treasurer's report for the month of August 2021.

For August 2021: Income for Operations was from donations \$30, research \$248.70, Fred Meyer Rewards \$31.46, interest \$2.74, total income for Operations of \$312.90; total income for August was \$312.90. Expenses for Operations were rent at Candalaria -\$344.21, copy cards Beaver Briefs -\$100, postage for mailing Beaver Briefs -\$46.80, postage for mailing publications brochure -\$39.60, new checks -\$33.97, overpayment -\$8.07, total expenses from Operations -\$556.51; Publications postage for mailing -\$5.50; total expenses -\$562.01. BALANCE of checking and savings on August 31, 2021, was \$31,554.30.

We discussed Pay Pal again: Pay Pal is linked to our checking account now. We also have a new email for Pay Pal, which officers can access. We hope to have Pay Pal set on our website by the time to do membership renewals.

2. Membership Report from Sue Rempel: We have 2 Societies, 20 Life members, 13 families/26 members, and 106 singles for 141 memberships or 154 members. New members are Muriel King Yachats (former member), Vicki Jo Beglau of Salem, Jolene Hall of Independence, Holly Short of Corvallis, Susan Newbill of Salem, Teresa Zimmerman of Sublimity.

3. General Meeting and speaker were cancelled for September and October. We will have an in-person general meeting on November 13th at the VFW Hall. Program will be to have members talk about their genealogical research during the pandemic. We will also provide lunch, drinks, and desserts.

4. Salem Public Library did not re-open September 1, 2021, at the remodeled library on Liberty St. We will be recruiting volunteers to work at Keizer Library.

5. Corresponding Secretary Tony Hoff reported "It was a busy month. We had 10 requests for research in August: 9 to our society (3 from the same person) and 1 to the Salem Public Library. There were requests for 10 obituaries, 3 marriage certificates, a naturalization record, and a newspaper article. In addition, there was a request to confirm date & place of birth, to obtain 8 generations on the paternal side, identify the father of an ancestor, provide information on DNA testing and to update a tree on Ancestry."

6. There will be a meeting for volunteers before we open up again at SPL.

7. Beaver Briefs #4 – Craig has articles completed. Due out November 1.

8. Dennis Hill has kept the website updated, as well as the password list for new members.

9. Old business- Genealogy classes at Senior Center begin October 11th.

10. New Business-officers for next year. As no meeting are being held, we will publish election information in the newsletter. Tony Hoff is retiring as Corresponding Secretary, so we need a new person to do research. Other officers will run again. We also need a Publicity Chairperson. The Board reviews dues in September and we voted to suspend dues for 2022. Members of the Board will have to meet with the head librarian and city attorney to review our agreement with the City of Salem.

Albany City Directories

- City directories were once published yearly and contained a lot more information than what was in period telephone books. Now they can be a valuable source to learn who previously lived in your home and how those earlier homeowners earned their livings. Names, addresses, some telephone numbers, and other information about the city are available in each directory. The oldest directory dates from 1878.

Genealogy Classes 2021

All classes will use Family Tree Magazine's State Guides. One state will be the focus and include the hand-out. State guides for other states can be downloaded to participant's laptops/tablets.

Class 1 Northeast Area of the US We will look in depth at resources available for Massachusetts and Pennsylvania. Other states are Maine, Vermont, New Hampshire, New York, Connecticut, Rhode Island, New Jersey, Delaware, and Maryland.

Class 2 Southeast Area of the US We will look in depth at resources for Virginia. Other states are West Virginia, Washington DC, North and South Carolina, Tennessee, Georgia, Florida, Alabama, Mississippi, Arkansas, and Louisiana

Class 3 Midwest Area of the US We will look in depth at Ohio. Other states are Kentucky, Missouri, Illinois, Indiana, Michigan, Wisconsin, Iowa, and Minnesota.

Class 4 Plains Area of the US We will focus on Texas. Other states will be Oklahoma, New Mexico, Kansas, Colorado, Nebraska, Wyoming, North and South Dakota, and Montana.

Class 5 Pacific West Area of the US We will look at Oregon and Washington. Other states are Idaho, California, Nevada, Utah, Arizona, Alaska and Hawaii.

OKLAHOMA State and colonial censuses

Oklahoma often took censuses in the years before and between the federal censuses, the dates are listed below. State census records may have columns that were different or more unusual than those found on federal censuses. The responses and years of coverage may give additional information on the family.

1907 Statistical State Census

1890 June Territorial Census: for the counties of Logan, Oklahoma, Cleveland, Canadian, Kingfisher, Payne, and Beaver only. A card index is available at the Oklahoma State Historical Society. A helpful source for locating families in this census is Smith's First Directory of Oklahoma Territory: For the Year Commencing August 1st, 1890.

Family History Library Film

1880 *The Cherokee Nation 1880 census* covering the Canadian, Cooweescoowee, Delaware, Flint, Going Snake, Illinois, Saline, Sequoyah and Tahlequah districts is for Indians only. This also includes census rolls of various years of Delaware Indians holding citizenship in the Cherokee Nation. The Cherokee Nation 1880 Indian census is indexed on the Internet at: <http://www.accessgenealogy.com/native/finalindex.php>. This index does not include census images.
