<u>Document Research:</u> Searches for Oregon documents can be done. If successful, the fee is \$10.00 per document or 3 for \$20.00 for nonmembers and \$5.00 per document or 3 for \$10.00 for WVGS members. If these require a trip to the Oregon State Archives, Marion County Clerk's Office or other sites, The fee is \$10.00 per document for members and non-members (3 for \$10/\$20 does not apply). The \$5 and \$10 charges include postage for 5 pages or less. If over 5 pages there will be a charge for postage and handling.

General Research

We will conduct searches using resources such as Ancestry.com, censuses, city directories, Oregon Donation Land Claims, newspapers, and other sources. General research is not restricted to research in Oregon only! The minimum fee for research is \$10, if successful. This includes a copy of one document. Research is \$10 per hour, \$5 for each additional 1/2 hour and the cost of additional documents. The \$5 and \$10 charges include postage for 5 pages or less. If over 5 pages there will be a charge for postage and handling. There is also a charge of 10 cents per page for every copy over 10 pages.

Membership for 2024

We have a new membership form in this newsletter. and on our website. Yearly dues will be \$30 for a single membership and \$40 for a family.

If you want to receive Beaver Briefs in print, the cost will still be an additional \$10.

Genealogy Help

Come visit our volunteers at the Genealogy Desk at Salem Public Library. We have volunteers from 11 am to 5 pm Tuesday to Thursday (library is open until 6 pm), 11 am to 5 pm Friday and Saturday. Salem Public Library is closed on Sundays and Mondays. Volunteers are there to help patrons, including members, for free with their genealogy questions. Volunteers have access to Ancestry.com, newspapers.com and other sites. Reminder: Ancestry.com Library Edition is free at Salem Public Library when you are there in person.



Irish Ancestry?

Irish genealogy resources



1. National Archives

The NAI's in-house Genealogy Service offers a free, short personal consultation service by professional genealogists, which can be invaluable to help you get started. It also maintains a wide range of searchable online records including census records of 1901 and 1911.



2. General Register Office

The GRO registers all civil birth, adoption, death, marriage and civil partnerships in the Republic of Ireland. At its Dublin office, you can search its collection of registers and buy photocopies of records. You can also order copies of certificates online.



3. National Library

The library offers a free walk-in advisory service for those looking to trace their family history, as well as genealogy workshops and talks. You'll also find microfilm copies of most surviving Roman Catholic parish registers, and other records that can be used as census substitutes.

Irish Genealogy



The best place to start with tracing your Irish ancestry is searching Irish Genealogy, where you can view Irish civil records for free. At present there are indexes to births (1864–1922), marriages (1845–1947) and deaths (1871-1972). There are also some church records, including both Catholic and Church of Ireland registers from County Carlow, Cork and Ross, Dublin and County Kerry.

DNA Testing Company Will Allow Customers to Opt Out of Helping FBI Amid Privacy Concerns

FamilyTreeDNA drew heat from privacy advocates after it was revealed that the company let the FBI access its database. A popular private DNA-testing service will now allow customers to bar law enforcement from accessing their genetic data after drawing criticism for giving the FBI access to its database.

The decision exposes the ethical and legal conundrums surrounding at-home DNA testing and illustrates the tension between protecting users' privacy and aiding law enforcement in catching violent criminals.
