Document Research: Searches for Oregon documents can be done. If successful, the fee is \$10.00 per document or 3 for \$20.00 for nonmembers and \$5.00 per document or 3 for \$10.00 for WVGS members. If these require a trip to the Oregon State Archives, Marion County Clerk's Office or other sites, the fee is \$10.00 per document for members and non-members (3 for \$10/\$20 does not apply). The \$5 and \$10 charges include postage for 5 pages or less. If over 5 pages there will be a charge for postage and handling.

General Research

We will conduct searches using resources such as Ancestry.com, censuses, city directories, Oregon Donation Land Claims, newspapers, and other sources. General research is not restricted to research in Oregon only! The minimum fee for research is \$10, if successful. This includes a copy of one document. Research is \$10 per hour, \$5 for each additional 1/2 hour and the cost of additional documents. The \$5 and \$10 charges include postage for 5 pages or less. If over 5 pages there will be a charge for postage and handling. There is also a charge of 10 cents per page for every copy over 10 pages.

Membership for 2024

We have a new membership form in this newsletter and on our website. Yearly dues will be \$30 for a single membership and \$40 for a family. If you want to receive Beaver Briefs in print, the cost will still be an additional \$10.

1-4 Vital Statistics

Vital statistics are the most basic events that define a person's existence; in fact, the definition of the term vital statistics is "statistics relating to births, deaths, marriages, health, and disease." So it's fitting that the first four of our top ten facts are birth, marriage, death, and burial. These are the most basic details we all naturally try and gather as beginner researchers.

5-6 Faith-Based Records

For most of our ancestors, affiliation with a particular faith or church was a prominent and defining factor in his or her life. For genealogists, knowing more about your ancestor's religion and their involvement in pivotal religious ceremonies can offer great clues for further research and help to confirm other facts you've gathered...and that's why these are our number five and six recommendations.

7-8 Occupational and Service Facts

What did your ancestor do for a living? Did they leave that job to serve in the military–or was being a soldier their lifetime occupation? Knowing your ancestor's usual occupation or industry and any military service they may have performed can give you great insight into their daily lives, talents, character, and perhaps even acts of heroism.

9-10 Geographical Information

The last two facts in our top ten–residences and migration–are certainly not among the least important. In fact, finding out where your ancestor lived at different times throughout his or her life is usually one of the first and most interesting searches you'll attempt as a beginning genealogist.
